Pursuant to California Evidence Code, sections 452 and 453, Respondents BAY AREA TOLL AUTHORITY (BATA) and METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION (MTC) request that the Court take judicial notice of the following evidence ("Subject Documents") in support of their Demurrer to Petition for Writ of Mandate and Complaint for Injunctive Relief, filed concurrently with this Request for Judicial Notice:

- 1. The CEQA Notice of Exemption prepared and filed by BATA on June 8, 2012 with the San Francisco County Clerk. A true copy is attached hereto as **Exhibit A**.
- 2. The CEQA Notice of Exemption prepared and filed by BATA on May 14, 2015 with the San Francisco County Clerk. A true copy is attached hereto as **Exhibit B**.
- 3. The CEQA Notice of Exemption prepared and filed by BATA on August 15, 2023 with the San Francisco County Clerk. A true copy is attached hereto as **Exhibit C**.
- 4. The January 11, 2023 agenda of the BATA Oversight Committee. A true copy is attached hereto as **Exhibit D**.
- 5. The January 11, 2023 staff report of the BATA Oversight Committee prepared for the Bay Lights Project Update. A true copy is attached hereto as **Exhibit E**.
- 6. The email exchange between Petitioner Mark Baker and BATA staff occurring between December 31, 2023 and January 2, 2024. A true copy is attached hereto as **Exhibit F**.
- 7. The Department of Justice's 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design. A true copy is attached hereto as **Exhibit G**.

BATA and MTC offer the following Memorandum of Points and Authorities in support of this request that the Court take judicial notice of the Subject Documents.

I. MEMORANDUM OF POINTS AND AUTHORITIES

California Evidence Code section 453 requires that a court shall take notice of any matters specified in Evidence Code section 452, provided that the party requesting notice gives each adverse party sufficient notice of the request to enable that party to respond, and furnishes the court with sufficient information to enable it to take judicial notice in the matter. (Evid. Code, § 453.) This Request for Judicial Notice satisfies these requirements because, as demonstrated further below, it provides notice to all parties of the request, attaches the Subject Documents, and provides sufficient information for the Court to take judicial notice of the Subject Documents.

A. The Subject Documents are relevant to the issues raised in BATA's and MTC's Demurrer.

The Demurrer argues that the statute of limitations is expired with respect to the first cause of action alleged in the Petition under CEQA. **Exhibits A, B, and C** are Notices of Exemption, which are relevant to commencement of the applicable limitations period under CEQA. Additionally, **Exhibits D and E** are documents prepared and published by BATA that show when the public was given notice of project changes, also relevant to commencement of the applicable limitations period under CEQA. Additionally, **Exhibit F** is an email showing when Petitioner had actual notice of project changes, also relevant to commencement of the applicable limitations period under CEQA.

The Demurrer also argues that the Petition's claim under the ADA fails as a matter of law. **Exhibit G** shows that the ADA in fact *requires* installation of LED lights in some instances.

B. The Subject Documents are Judicially Noticeable

1. The Court should take judicial notice of Exhibits A, B, and C under Evidence Code section 452(c).

A court may take judicial notice of "[o]fficial acts of... any state of the United States." (Evid. Code, § 452(c).) This includes records of public agencies. (*Rodas v. Spiegel* (2001) 87 Cal.App.4th 513, 518 ("*Rodas*").) Notices of Exemption under CEQA are subject to judicial notice pursuant to this provision. (*Stockton Citizens for Sensible Planning v. City of Stockton* (2012) 210 Cal.App.4th 1484, 1488, fn. 3.)

Exhibits A, B, and C are Notices of Exemption prepared by BATA and filed with the San Francisco County Clerk. Therefore, judicial notice of their existence and content is proper.

2. The Court should take judicial notice of Exhibits D and E under Evidence Code section 452(c).

As stated above, a court may take judicial notice of "[o]fficial acts of... any state of the United States," including the records of public agencies. (Evid. Code, § 452(c); *Rodas*, *supra*, 87 Cal.App.4th at p. 518.)

Exhibit D is the public agenda of the January 11, 2023 meeting of the BATA Oversight Committee. **Exhibit E** is a report prepared for and attached to that public agenda. Such records are

3. The Court should take judicial notice of Exhibit F under Evidence Code section 452(h).

A court may take judicial notice of "[f]acts and propositions that are not reasonably subject to dispute and are capable of immediate and accurate determination by resort to sources of reasonably indisputable accuracy." (Evid. Code, § 452(h).) **Exhibit F** is an email from Petitioner Mark Baker, and the response to Petitioner Mark Baker. As there is no genuine dispute as to their authenticity, and judicial notice is only sought of the existence and content of the document, and not the truth of any assertions therein, judicial notice is proper. (See *Fontenot v. Wells Fargo Bank, N.A.* (2011) 198 Cal.App.4th 256, 264 [judicial notice found proper under Evidence Code section 452(h) where the authenticity of the documents is not challenged].)

4. The Court should take judicial notice of Exhibit G under Evidence Code section 452(b), (c).

A court may take judicial notice of, "[r]egulations and legislative enactments issued by or under the authority of the United States or any public entity in the United States," and, as discussed above, "[o]fficial acts of the legislative, executive, and judicial departments of the United States and of any state of the United States." (Evid. Code, § 452(b), (c).)

Exhibit G contains regulations adopted by the United States Department of Justice. Therefore, its existence and content is judicially noticeable.

C. <u>Conclusion</u>

A court "shall" take judicial notice of any matter specified in section 452 if a party requests it, gives sufficient notice of the request, and furnishes the court with sufficient information to enable it to take judicial notice of the matter. (Evid. Code, § 453.) Because BATA and MTC have requested that this Court take judicial notice of the Subject Documents, have given Petitioner sufficient notice of the request, and furnished the Court with sufficient information to take judicial notice, BATA and MTC respectfully request the Court take judicial notice of the Subject

The Bay Lights Project Update

Subject:

Update of the Bay Lights Project on the San Francisco Oakland Bay Bridge.

Background:

The Bay Lights is an art display sponsored by the non-profit organization Illuminate (formerly Illuminate the Arts) and was developed to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the San Francisco-Oakland Bay Bridge (Bay Bridge). The existing light sculpture by artist Leo Villareal is composed of 24,000 individual light-emitting diodes (LEDs) installed on the north suspension cables of the west span. The Bay Lights was first commissioned as a two-year temporary installation on March 5, 2013. The Bay Lights was replaced in-kind in the Fall of 2015 and recommissioned in February 2016 as a permanent installation gifted to Caltrans with maintenance supported by the Bay Area Toll Authority (BATA).

Due to an aging system, Illuminate proposes to replace the Bay Lights in 2023, around the 10th anniversary of the original Bay Lights going live. The removal of the existing LEDs is anticipated to begin March 5, 2023, with the installation of a new The Bay Lights 360 (TBL360) Project scheduled to be illuminated on September 3, 2023, in celebration of the 10th anniversary of the Bay Bridge East Span.

The new TBL360 Project will install forty-eight thousand (48,000) new energy-efficient LEDs, replacing the existing LEDs on the north side and adding new LEDs on the driver's (south-facing) side of the same suspender cables on the west span of the bridge for a 360-degree view of the lights. TBL360 will include updated and more robust components while keeping the same technical details and intensity of the lights as the current installation. The new TBL360 will be visible from all directions (360-degree view) for increased aesthetic equity and will be lit from dusk to dawn. The lights on the San Francisco and the East Bay sides will have separate control systems so they can be turned off independently if necessary. The light display will continue to appear to be moving in a wave-like and alternating flickering non-repeatable but abstract pattern, consistent with the existing lighting and will be programmed by artist Leo Villareal.

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Illuminate is working on raising \$11 million in private funding for the replacement of the Bay Lights. BATA would continue to support the maintenance of the installation at \$400,000 per year (not included in the \$11 million capital cost). With approval by the BATA Oversight Committee in December 2014, Illuminate, Caltrans, and BATA entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to document their intentions to keep the lights on indefinitely. In the MOU, Caltrans agreed to assume ownership of the Bay Lights contingent upon reimbursement by BATA for any operations and maintenance costs borne by Caltrans. An amendment to the existing MOU between Caltrans, Illuminate, and BATA to extend the previous MOU arrangement is currently under discussion.

BATA intends to enter into a new ten-year fixed price maintenance contract with Illuminate's TBL360 contractor to ensure consistency and quality in the appearance of the Bay Lights.

Next Steps:

Staff will be returning for Committee in mid-2023 with a recommendation for the approval of the maintenance services contract for The Bay Lights 360.

Dear Metropolitan Transportation Commission,

I have learned that the MTC is considering authorizing the use of tens of thousands of hazardous LED lights to be operated on the Bay Bridge by the organization Illuminate. (https://sfstandard.com/2023/12/28/san-franciscbay-bridge-light-show-could-return-in-2024/).

LEDs emit hazardous visible radiation that causes certain individuals to suffer seizures, migraines, panic attacks, nausea and other adverse neurological reactions. LED products are regulated by the US Food and Drug Administration, and yet the FDA has not published the Congressionally mandated performance standards to ensure the comfort, health, safety, and civil rights of the public as required by 21 U.S.C. 360ii. Therefore, there is no legal basis for the use of LED lights such as proposed by Illuminate. LED lights are unsafe.

This is a formal Americans with Disabilities Act request for accommodation for myself, and all those individuals similarly situated who cannot neurologically process the intense, spatially non-uniform light emitted by LEDs. The accommodation I request is the denial of any permit for Illuminate to operate the LED display on the Bay Bridge or any other location, due to the discriminatory barrier that their use will create, preventing certain individuals with disabilities , including myself, from having full and equal access to the Bay Bridge and other city services. My request is reasonable and readily achievable.

Here is a link to my ADA lawsuit that I recently filed against the city of Fairfield, California regarding LED lights which provides detailed information as to why the MTC is required to provide accommodation for LED lights: (https://www.softlights.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/12/Baker-v-Fairfield_Filed.pdf). - **404.2.8 Closing Speed.** Door and gate closing speed shall comply with 404.2.8.
 - **404.2.8.1 Door Closers and Gate Closers.** Door closers and gate closers shall be adjusted so that from an open position of 90 degrees, the time required to move the door to a position of 12 degrees from the latch is 5 seconds minimum.
 - **404.2.8.2 Spring Hinges.** Door and gate spring hinges shall be adjusted so that from the open position of 70 degrees, the door or gate shall move to the closed position in 1.5 seconds minimum.
- **404.2.9 Door and Gate Opening Force.** Fire doors shall have a minimum opening force allowable by the appropriate *administrative authority*. The force for pushing or pulling open a door or gate other than fire doors shall be as follows:
 - 1. Interior hinged doors and gates: 5 pounds (22.2 N) maximum.
 - 2. Sliding or folding doors: 5 pounds (22.2 N) maximum.

These forces do not apply to the force required to retract latch bolts or disengage other devices that hold the door or gate in a closed position.

Advisory 404.2.9 Door and Gate Opening Force. The maximum force pertains to the continuous application of force necessary to fully open a door, not the initial force needed to overcome the inertia of the door. It does not apply to the force required to retract bolts or to disengage other devices used to keep the door in a closed position.

404.2.10 Door and Gate Surfaces. Swinging door and gate surfaces within 10 inches (255 mm) of the finish floor or ground measured vertically shall have a smooth surface on the push side extending the full width of the door or gate. Parts creating horizontal or vertical joints in these surfaces shall be within 1/16 inch (1.6 mm) of the same plane as the other. Cavities created by added kick plates shall be capped.

EXCEPTIONS: 1. Sliding doors shall not be required to comply with 404.2.10.

- 2. Tempered glass doors without stiles and having a bottom rail or shoe with the top leading edge tapered at 60 degrees minimum from the horizontal shall not be required to meet the 10 inch (255 mm) bottom smooth surface height requirement.
- **3.** Doors and gates that do not extend to within 10 inches (255 mm) of the finish floor or ground shall not be required to comply with 404.2.10.
- **4.** Existing doors and gates without smooth surfaces within 10 inches (255 mm) of the finish floor or ground shall not be required to provide smooth surfaces complying with 404.2.10 provided that if added kick plates are installed, cavities created by such kick plates are capped.
- **404.2.11 Vision Lights.** Doors, gates, and side lights adjacent to doors or gates, containing one or more glazing panels that permit viewing through the panels shall have the bottom of at least one glazed panel located 43 inches (1090 mm) maximum above the finish floor.

EXCEPTION: Vision lights with the lowest part more than 66 inches (1675 mm) from the finish floor or ground shall not be required to comply with 404.2.11.

404.3 Automatic and Power-Assisted Doors and Gates. Automatic doors and automatic gates shall comply with 404.3. Full-powered automatic doors shall comply with ANSI/BHMA A156.10 (incorporated
